“.... See, I have set before you an open door, and no one can shut it...”
~ Revelation 3:8 (NKJV)

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

Welcome to 2025, our year of OPEN DOORS. Through this 21-day devotional you will be enlightened about the meaning, implication and purpose of “open doors”. The purpose of fasting is not to force God to do what we want Him to do, but to see His face and understand His ways. Fasting is a physical act of obedience that brings our spirit, soul and body together in order to experience Him in a new way. Hence, I am challenging you to be focused and expectant as you participate in this challenge.

The 21-day fast will be a normal fast, which implies going without food every day until after the corporate prayer which will end around 6:45pm. During this period, you can drink water, tea, coffee, or juice moderately. Fasting is not an obligation; it is about a relationship and connecting to God in a more powerful way through prayer and meditation on God’s Word. As we pray and read God’s Word, we are drawing closer to God and positioning ourselves to hear from Him better and clearer as we look forward to a wonderful 2025.

PERSONAL PRAYER TIMES: Individuals are encouraged to spend at least 1 hour every day to read the bible passage and pray before the corporate prayer times. See the table below for a recommended 1-hour prayer model sample for the 21-day challenge.

CORPORATE PRAYER TIMES: 6pm daily except for the 21st day.

TOGUE OF FIRE PRAYER CONFERENCE: On the last day of the Challenge, which is January 25, 2025, we will hold an all-day prayer conference from 8:30AM – 6:00PM. The venue is the Church sanctuary.

What is an Open Door?

Revelation 3:7-13

Key Passage: Revelation 3:8 - *“I know your works. See, I have set before you an open door, and no one can shut it; for you have a little strength, have kept My word, and have not denied My name.” ~ (NKJV)*”

Reflection: The concept of "open doors" as a metaphor for opportunities is used frequently throughout scripture. The word "door" appears in various contexts across the Bible, often signifying God's provision or access to something new. Many times in our lives we feel unsure about the path ahead. Challenges, doubts, and fears often make us hesitate at the verge of new opportunities. Yet, God promises us something powerful in Revelation 3:8: an open door. This represents God's invitation to step into His plans, purposes, and blessings.

Naturally the opposite of an open door is a closed door which we sometimes face in life. While closed doors signify rejection or limitation, open doors signify opportunities, freedom, and possibilities. God's open door is also a call to action, a beckoning to step forward in faith.

When God opens a door, no one can shut it. What a great assurance! No obstacle, opposition, nor setback can prevent you from walking through the opportunities He places before you. You can move forward with confidence, knowing that He is the One who opens and closes doors, and His plans are always good. As we face new seasons or decisions, let's trust that God is guiding us. When He opens a door, He's not just making a way for us; He's also preparing us for something greater. Take a moment today to reflect on the open doors in your life. Will you walk through them with faith, knowing that He is waiting on the other side?

1. Thank God for seeing you through the year 2024; for His faithfulness upon your life and fulfilment of His will in your life in 2024.
2. Thank God for the new year 2025; for the promises it brings, for the new blessings, favor, and opportunities the New Year brings to us. Lam. 3:22-23
3. Thank God for the Word for the new year, our year of OPEN DOORS. Pray that this word will become your experience in 2025. Luke 1:38
4. Pray that the word will work for you as you have chosen to believe it. 1 Thessalonians 2:13
5. Ask the Lord to help you to recognize and trust in the open doors He places before you this year and to give you the courage to step forward in faith.
6. Ask God for open doors so that you can walk into God's plans and purpose in your ministry, career, business, relationship etc.
7. Pray that this year every closed door will open, and every open door will remain open.
8. Pray that in 2025 your door will stay open day and night to receive the wealth of and the blessing that God has for you. Isaiah 60:11

How to Recognize Open Doors from God

Psalm 32:1-9

Key Verse: Psalm 32:8 – *“I will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go; I will guide you with My eye.” (NKJV)*

Reflection: Recognizing open doors from God is essential for following His will. Life can be full of choices, and not every opportunity is a path God intends for us. So how do we discern when God is opening a door?

First, seek God through prayer. When we align our hearts with His, He will guide us in the right direction. Ask for wisdom, and trust that He will direct your steps. The Holy Spirit is our helper, and He leads us in the way of peace and purpose.

Second, check for peace. God's open doors often come with a sense of peace, even in the midst of uncertainty. If you're unsure, seek counsel from mature believers who can offer biblical wisdom and encouragement. Wise counsel can be a confirmation of God's will.

Third, evaluate whether the opportunity aligns with God's Word. An open door from God will never contradict His truth. If the opportunity is in line with biblical principles and His character, it's a sign that God may be calling you to walk through it.

Finally, be patient. Sometimes God opens doors slowly, and we must wait for His timing. Trust that His perfect timing will reveal the door in due season. Remember, God is faithful to guide us. As we stay close to Him, He will open the right doors at the right time.

1. Thank God for how great the love is that the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God. 1 John 3:1
2. Pray that the Lord will help you to recognize your open doors of opportunities in your life and guide your steps and give you the wisdom to follow His will.
3. Pray the eyes of your understanding will be enlightened; to know the hope of His calling and see the riches of His inheritance for you. Ephesians 1:18
4. For AHOW – pray for open doors of ministry that God will open the hearts and eyes of the people He has called us to reach.
5. Pray that AHOW will become a door of blessing to many people where they will encounter God's plans and purposes for their lives.
6. Pray for children in AHOW, that they will have a deeper revelation of God's love for them and will know that they are unconditionally loved by God.
7. Pray for the new believers in AHOW churches, that they will grow in God's grace, love, and in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. 2 Peter 3:18
8. Pray that they may have power, together with all saints, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep the love of Christ is for them. Ephesians 3:18

Why People Miss Open Doors

Ephesians 5:1-20

Key Verse: *Ephesians 5:16-17* - "Making the most of every opportunity, because the days are evil. Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the Lord's will is." (NIV)

Reflection: In life, God opens doors of opportunity, but many people miss them. In Ephesians 5:16-17, Paul challenges us to make the most of every opportunity, to not be foolish, and to understand God's will. Why, then, do people often miss open doors? One reason is distraction. The busyness of life, the noise of the world, and the demands of our schedules can keep us from recognizing the doors God has set before us. We may be so focused on our own plans that we fail to see what God is doing in the present moment. If we're not intentional about tuning into God's voice, we can easily overlook His opportunities.

Another reason people miss open door is fear. When faced with an open door, fear of the unknown or fear of failure can make us hesitate or turn away. Yet, God calls us to step forward in faith, knowing that He is with us and will equip us for the journey. The danger of fear is so real that it is one of the most repeated promises in the bible. (Isaiah 41:10, Psalm 27:1, Psalm 46:1-3, 2 Timothy 1:7)

Lastly, some miss open doors because they are not seeking God's will. Ephesians 5:17 urges us to understand what the Lord's will is. If we are not seeking God's guidance through prayer and His Word, we may miss the doors He is opening. Let's be intentional, discerning, and faithful, recognizing and stepping through the doors God provides.

1. It's day 3 of our 21-day challenge; thank God for giving you the strength so far and that He will continue to give you strength until the end.
2. Lord, help me recognize the doors You open for me. Give me the wisdom to discern Your will and the courage to walk through them.
3. Pray for grace to always be at the right place at the right time to sieve the opportunities God is bringing to you.
4. Pray against every distraction in your life that the enemy uses to cause you to miss your open doors.
5. Pray against the spirit of fear that may cause you to miss your God-given opportunities. 2 Timothy 1:7
6. Pray that AHOW members will develop a desire to know God such that the scripture will be fulfilled, "No longer will they teach their neighbor, or say to one another, 'Know the Lord,' because they will all know me." Heb.8:11
7. Pray for grace for radical obedience in AHOW. AHOW will not just be a church of bench warmers but of people who are committed to obeying God.
8. Ask God for overcoming grace and faith to live a victorious life in every area of your life in 2025. 1 John 5:4-5

The Need for Preparation for Open Doors

Ecclesiastes 9:1-12

Key Verse: Ecclesiastes 9:11 - *"I have seen something else under the sun: The race is not to the swift or the battle to the strong, nor does food come to the wise or wealth to the brilliant or favor to the learned; but time and chance happen to them all."* – Ecclesiastes 9:11 (NIV)

Reflection: In Ecclesiastes 9:11, Solomon reflects on the unpredictability of life—how success doesn't always go to the strongest, fastest, or most intelligent. Instead, opportunities, or "open doors," often come through timing and chance. Yet, this doesn't mean we should wait passively. Preparation plays a vital role in how we respond to those doors when they open.

God's timing is perfect, but our preparation helps us walk through the doors He opens with readiness. Look at athletes; while they can't control the exact timing of the race, their preparation ensures they are ready when the time comes. Similarly, God often opens doors, but our spiritual, emotional, and practical preparation determines whether we can seize the opportunity.

Preparation doesn't just mean acquiring skills; it also means cultivating a heart of faith. When we spend time in prayer, studying Scripture, and trusting God in small things, we are preparing ourselves for the big opportunities He will present. Our readiness allows us to act when the door opens, rather than hesitating or feeling unqualified. God's open doors may come unexpectedly, but with preparation, we can step through them with faith and assurance, knowing He has equipped us for every good work.

1. It's day 4 of our 21-day challenge; thank God for giving you the strength so far and that He will continue to give you strength until the end.
2. Ask God to help you prepare for the doors He will open and give you the wisdom and faith to step through them in His perfect timing.
3. Pray that you will yield to the Holy Spirit as He teaches you to prepare for the open doors that God is bringing your way. Psalm 144:1
4. Pray that you will be faithful in little things even as the Holy Spirit prepares you for bigger doors. Luke 16:10
5. Pray that God will prepare your heart, mind and attitude through His Word; your desire will go beyond just hearing the word but applying it in every area of your life. 2 Timothy 2:15
6. Pray that the word of God will give you wisdom to build every aspect of your life and prepare you for God's plan for your life.
7. Pray that AHOW members will develop a desire to know God such that the scripture will be fulfilled.
8. For AHOW - Pray that God will prepare us for His end time move and His plans for us as a church. Luke 12:37

Dealing with Opposition to Open Doors

1 Corinthians 16:5-18

Key Verse: 1 Corinthians 16:9 - *"Because a great door for effective work has opened to me, and there are many who oppose me."* (NIV)

Reflection: In 1 Corinthians 16:9, Paul acknowledges a powerful truth: open doors for God's work often come with opposition. When God opens a door of opportunity in our lives—whether in ministry, career, or relationships—we can expect challenges. These "oppositions to open doors" may come in many forms: discouragement, criticism, spiritual warfare, or personal doubts.

However, opposition doesn't mean the door wasn't meant for you. Instead, it's often a sign that you are on the right path. The enemy will try to hinder your progress, but remember, God is greater than any force that stands against you. When God opens a door, no opposition can ultimately shut it unless He allows it.

One way to deal with enemies of open doors is through prayer. Prayer gives us strength, guidance, and clarity as we navigate challenges. It's in the moments of resistance that we often experience God's provision and power more fully. We can also lean on Scripture, which reminds us that God is our defender and that we have victory in Christ.

Another key is perseverance. Even in the face of opposition, continue walking forward in faith. Just as Paul pressed on despite opposition, we too can trust that God will make a way.

1. It's day 5 of our 21-day challenge; thank God for giving you the strength so far and that He will continue to give you strength until the end.
2. Lord, when faced with opposition, help me trust in Your strength and remain steadfast. May I walk boldly through the doors You've opened for me.
3. With every level God has for you, there is a devil to contend with - Pray that God will give you an unquenchable desire for His Word; your desire will go beyond just hearing the word but applying it in every area of your life.
4. Pray for grace to stand and be strong in the Lord and in His mighty power so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. Ephesians 6:10-11
5. Pray that you will put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand. Ephesians 6:13
6. Pray that AHOW members will develop a desire to know God such that the scripture will be fulfilled, "No longer will they teach their neighbor, or say to one another, 'Know the Lord,' because they will all know me." Heb.8:11
7. Pray for grace for radical obedience in AHOW. AHOW will not just be a church of bench warmers but of people who are committed to obeying God.
8. Ask God for overcoming grace and faith to live a victorious life in every area of your life in 2025. 1 John 5:4-5

Discerning the Right Doors

James 1:1-8

Key Verse: James 1:5 *“If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask of God, who gives to all liberally and without reproach, and it will be given to him.” – (NKJV)*

Reflection: As we have been learning in this devotion, success in life comes when God presents us with various opportunities (Psalm 75:6, Ecclesiastes 9:11). However, it is important to note that not all doors are aligned with His will. In our passage today, James encourages us to ask God for wisdom, and He will give it generously. He also cautions us in James 3:15, that some wisdom comes from worldly, sensual, or even demonic sources. This distinction is crucial as we seek to discern the right doors to walk through.

Worldly wisdom is often driven by selfish ambition, pride, and short-term gain, and can lead us to doors that seem appealing but ultimately lead to destruction. On the other hand, godly wisdom is pure, peace-loving, considerate, full of mercy, and produces righteousness (James 3:17). When discerning open doors, we must evaluate if the opportunity aligns with God’s character and long-term purposes for our lives.

As we ask God for wisdom, we should also evaluate our motivations. Is the door opening because of a selfish desire, or does it reflect a heart aligned with God’s will? Prayer and reflection on Scripture are essential tools in making wise decisions. The more we fill our hearts with God’s wisdom (through His word), the more we develop the mind of Christ that helps us to rightly discern His will and the right opportunities.

1. It’s day 6 of the 21-day challenge. Thank God for the grace He has poured upon us, for the great things He has done so far and for even greater things.
2. Thank God for the ministry of the Holy Spirit in our life – for He guides us into all truth and against every deception.
3. Pray for the Spirit of discernment to be able to discern the right opportunities as they come.
4. Pray that you will be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God. Rom. 12:1-2
5. Pray that God will purify your heart, desire and motive that will align you with God’s will and purpose in every situation.
6. Pray for our children in AHOW that God will fill them with wisdom, knowledge and discernment.
7. Pray that our children will be taught by the LORD, and great will be their peace. Isaiah 54:13
9. Pray that our children will shine among others like stars in the sky and be blameless and pure, “children of God without fault in a warped and crooked generation.” Philippians 2:15

Discerning God’s Timing in Opening Doors

Ecclesiastes 3:1-8

Key Verse: *Ecclesiastes 3:1* “There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens.” (NIV)

Reflection: Many times in life we find ourselves waiting for doors to open, unsure of when or how the right opportunity will come. Ecclesiastes 3:1-8 reminds us that everything has a season. There is a time for every purpose under heaven, and God's timing in opening doors is always perfect. Hence, discerning God’s timing is very critical in recognizing open doors.

You may be eager for the next step or frustrated by the delays, but God knows the precise moment when the door should open. Verses 2-8 describe a rhythm of life, filled with different seasons such as planting, uprooting, weeping, and laughing—times of joy and sorrow, all governed by God’s sovereign timing. Just as we wouldn’t expect to plant seeds and see a harvest immediately, there are times when God is preparing us or others before the door opens fully.

Trusting in God’s timing means surrendering our own expectations and embracing His perfect plan. Even in waiting, we must trust that He is working behind the scenes, aligning circumstances and preparing us to step through the door when the time is right. As you wait for God to open a door, remember that His timing is not delayed—it’s perfect. He is working out everything for your good, shaping you for the next season of growth and opportunity.

1. Thank God for His sovereignty and control over every area of your life. Knowing that He is the one who opens doors that no one can shut and shuts doors that no one can open.
2. Ask God for discernment to recognize different seasons of life and for wisdom to act accordingly. 1 Chronicles 12:32
3. Ask the Holy Spirit for strength and encouragement during your times of waiting for doors to open. Pray that you will not grow weary knowing that your due time is coming. Galatians 6:9
4. Ask God for boldness to walk through your opened doors. Declare you will not to be afraid but will have the courage to step into the opportunities as they come.
5. Pray against every plan of the enemy to steal your time through errors, mistakes, distractions and the likes. Ephesians 5:16
6. Pray for believers all over the world who are going through persecutions because of their faith that they will receive strength and comfort from God.
7. Pray for people in our midst who are going through challenges and delay that God will come through for them this year.
9. Ask God for restoration in every area you have missed God’s timing. Pray that God’s mercy will bring restoration of years stolen. Joel 2:25

The Open Door of Ministry

1 Corinthians 16:5-18

Key Verse: 1 Corinthians 16:9 *“because a wide door for effective ministry has opened for me —yet many oppose me.” Christian Standard Bible*

Reflection: Today we will revisit 1 Cor. 16:9 but with a different emphasis. One area where "open doors" applies greatly is in the work of the ministry. Every one of us has a ministry – which is the assignment God has given you in the kingdom. One of the ways we know where God is calling us is through “open doors.” Open doors in ministry represents opportunities —places, people, and situations where God is at work and calls us to join Him. These doors can be seen in many forms: a chance to serve others, share the Gospel, or bring encouragement to those in need. Hence, we much watch for open doors as we seek to serve God.

Sometimes, the doors God opens might seem daunting or beyond our abilities. However, it’s important to remember that the open door is not about our power, but about God’s provision. In 2 Corinthians 3:5, Paul reminds us, "Not that we are competent in ourselves to claim anything for ourselves, but our competence comes from God." When He opens a door, He also equips us to walk through it, no matter the challenges we may face.

As you reflect on your life today, consider: Are there open doors in your life that God is calling you to step through? Whether it’s in your home, workplace, or church community, trust that God has equipped you for the work He’s set before you. Walk confidently, knowing He is with you every step of the way.

1. Thank God because you are His handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do. Ephesians 2:10
2. Thank God for the open doors He is setting before you. Ask Him to open your eyes to see the opportunities around you to serve and spread the gospel.
3. Pray that God will grant you the courage and boldness to step out in faith as you walk through the open doors He provides.
4. Ask God for protection against every form of opposition, discouragement, or attack from the enemy that threatens to hinder you from pursuing the calling He has placed on your life.
5. Pray for open doors of favor and divine connections in your ministry. Pray that God will bring people into your path who will support, encourage, and partner with you in advancing His Kingdom.
6. Pray for AHOWFC - that God will open new frontiers of ministry for us to be a blessing to many in our communities and around the world.
7. Pray that the Holy Spirit will confirm His words in our midst with miracles, signs and wonders like never before. Mark 16:20
8. Pray that AHOW doors will continually be opened so that the unsaved, the sick, the broken and the oppressed will come in and encounter Jesus the door.

The Open Doors of Opportunities

Ephesians 5:8-20

Key Verse: Ephesians 5:15-16 *“Be very careful, then, how you live—not as unwise but as wise, 16 making the most of every opportunity, because the days are evil.” (NIV)*

Reflection: Ever been in a situation where you were looking for a job, applied for months, no response, and when you have a response, nothing happens? And for six months or one year you feel invisible, as if there is no job out there or no one sees your resume. Then all of a sudden, out of nowhere every recruiter starts calling you, everyone wants you and you end up with multiple offers to choose from. And you are thinking, where have you all been all this while? How come all of a sudden everyone sees me now and thinks I’m the best?

This scenario depicts the difference between operating under a closed versus open door. When doors are closed, nothing happens no matter how much you try. You work hard but nothing clicks. But when the door opens, everything works. Even your mistake creates an opportunity for you. It is as if you can do no wrong.

Success in life comes when God opens doors for us. Ecclesiastes 9:11 *“The fastest runner doesn’t always win the race, and the strongest warrior doesn’t always win the battle. The wise sometimes go hungry, and the skillful are not necessarily wealthy. And those who are educated don’t always lead successful lives. It is all decided by chance, by being in the right place at the right time.”* It’s exciting that this year is being declared our year of open door. The enemy is the one that closes doors of opportunity. God is the opener of doors of opportunities.

1. Thank God for grace and strength He has given you to enter into day 9 of the 21-day challenge. Thank Him for the blessings so far and yet to come.
2. Ask God to open your eyes to see the doors He is opening in your life and give you the wisdom to recognize the right ones to step through.
3. Pray that the Lord will baptize you with the spirit of grace and prayer, and release on you grace for prayers that unlock closed doors. Zechariah 12:10
4. Ask God to remove fear or doubt that may hold you back and to empower you to act boldly as He leads you into new ventures.
5. Ask God to help you make clear decisions that align with His will as you face multiple opportunities; Lead you in paths of righteousness and help you to choose the doors that will best glorify Him.
6. Pray for opportunities for our young people in AHOW to succeed in their education, careers and other endeavors.
7. For AHOW - Pray that the Holy Spirit will confirm His words in our midst with miracles, signs and wonders like never before. Mark 16:20
8. Pray that AHOW doors will continually be opened so that the unsaved, the sick, the broken and the oppressed will come in and encounter. Isaiah 60:11.

The Open Doors of Provision

Philippians 4:10-19

Key Verse: *Philippians 4:19* "And my God will meet all your needs according to the riches of his glory in Christ Jesus." (NIV)

Reflection: Today we will talk about the door of provision. When the door of provision is closed, people struggle no matter how hard they work. When it is open, provision and abundance come easily. That is why we ask God for an open door of provision. The door of provision opens wide to remind us that God is our ultimate provider. Philippians 4:19 reassures us that God will meet all our needs according to His glorious riches not according to our limitations but according to His abundant resources. He knows our needs even before we ask and promises to provide.

In Malachi 3:10 God promises to open windows (and doors) and pour out blessings in abundance when we honor Him by bringing our tithes and offerings. God challenges us to open our hearts and give generously, knowing He will always provide for us more than enough.

In Deuteronomy 8:18, we are reminded that God gives us the ability to create wealth. Our provision comes not only through direct gifts but also through the talents, skills, and opportunities God has placed in our lives. As we acknowledge God as the source of all provision, we step into the door of blessing and security.

The door of provision is a place of trust and thanksgiving. As we rely on God's promises and walk in obedience, we experience His endless supply.

1. Thank God for the generous grace of our Lord Jesus Christ who though was rich, yet for your sakes became poor, so that by His poverty He could make you rich. 2 Corinthians 8:9
2. Thank God for His promises to supply all our needs not according to our works but according to His riches in glory in Christ Jesus.
3. Pray that God will open doors of provision for you richly to enjoy, fulfill your assignment and to be a blessing to the kingdom of God. 1 Timothy 6:17
4. Pray that God will unlock the ability to create wealth that He has put in you and give you the courage to step into it. Deuteronomy 8:18
5. Pray that God will release the grace of generosity upon AHOW and unlock a heart of generosity in AHOW members for His kingdom. 2 Corinthians 8:7
6. Pray that God will open the window of heaven concerning AHOW, that there will be abundant supply of provision to fulfil His purpose in AHOW.
7. Pray for AHOW that our gates will always stand open, they will never be shut, day or night, so that people may bring you the wealth of the nations—their kings led in triumphal procession. Isaiah 60:11
8. Pray that AHOW will be a place of abundance, where God will meet everyone's needs and even make them a blessing to others. Genesis 12:2

Dealing with Closed Doors

Acts 16:1-10

Key Verse: Acts 16:6– *“Paul and his companions traveled throughout the region of Phrygia and Galatia, having been kept by the Holy Spirit from preaching the word in the province of Asia.” (NIV)*

Reflection: One of the challenges we all deal with in life is that of “closed doors”. Closed doors can be frustrating, especially when we’ve prayed, hoped, and worked toward a specific goal and nothing changes. This could be a job opportunity, a relationship, or a dream that seems out of reach. Closed doors often leave us wondering why things aren’t working out. Yet, we must remember that God’s wisdom is greater than our own understanding.

In our passage a door of ministry was closed (by the Holy Spirit) for Paul but a bigger door eventually opened. When God closes a door, He is often protecting us from missing His plans for us. It’s easy to focus on what is lost, instead of focusing on the greater plan God has for us. The Bible assures us that His plans are for our good, even when they don’t align with our immediate desires. In times of closed doors, we must trust in God’s sovereignty. He knows what is best for us, and His timing is always perfect.

Just like Paul, instead of getting discouraged when a door closes, we can look at closed doors as invitations to seek God’s will even more deeply. Ask Him to reveal His plan for your life and give you the patience to trust Him during your seasons of waiting. Remember, God never leaves us in uncertainty. For a child of God closed doors are sometimes just as important as His open doors because they lead us to the path He has chosen for us.

1. Thank God for how great the love is that the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God. 1 John 3:1
2. Thank God because He causes all things to work for your good because you love him and have been called according to His purpose. Rom. 8:28
3. Pray that the Lord will help you trust Him even when doors are closed and teach you to rest in His perfect plan and timing. Amen.
4. Ask God for the Spirit of discernment to discern your closed doors and the approach He wants you to take.
5. Speak to every door that the enemy has closed in every area of your life and command them to open in the name of Jesus. Psalm 24:7
6. Some closed doors require specific spiritual keys, ask God for keys to every closed door in your life. Matthew 16:19
7. Some doors are closed because God is opening bigger and better doors – ask God to open your eyes to see the bigger and better doors He is opening.
8. Some doors must be permanently closed – declare that every door of bad news, death and satanic affliction be permanently shut. Revelation 3:7-8

The Keys of the Kingdom

Matthew 16:13-20

Key Verse: Matthew 16:19 *“I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven; whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven.”*

Reflection: There are two ways a door can open for you; one way is for someone to open it (i.e. from inside), another is for you to have the key. In this powerful declaration in Matthew 16:19, Jesus speaks to Peter, to all believers who follow in his footsteps, “I will give you the keys of the kingdom”. The "keys of the kingdom" represent access to unlock doors in the spiritual realm, entrusted by Christ Himself and to our inheritance and blessing in Christ Jesus.

Every door has a key. If you don't have a key to a door, it doesn't matter what you have. Yelling, force and kicking can't replace keys. Keys symbolize control, access, power and resources of the kingdom. The keys of the kingdom allow believers to unlock the truth of God's Word, the abundant life available through Christ and the heavenly resources available to us.

You will notice that Jesus uses the plural form of the word “keys” here, signifying there are many doors of the resources of the kingdom of God available for us to unlock. If you are going to enjoy the benefits of the kingdom, we must have the right keys. Today, take a moment to reflect on the authority Christ has given you. Are you using your "keys" to build His kingdom, to bring healing, to forgive, and to proclaim the Good News? Trust that as you do, God works in heaven and on earth to fulfill His will.

1. Thank God for the authority He has granted you in Christ through the keys of the Kingdom.
2. Pray that God will teach you how to walk in the dominion He has given you, using the keys to unlock His will on earth as it is in heaven.
3. Ask God for wisdom to discern when and how to use the keys; to know when and what to bind and to lose. Matthew 16:19
4. Pray for a greater sensitivity to the Holy Spirit to identify, understand and know how to use the different keys of the kingdom.
5. Pray that the keys you hold will open doors to salvation, healing, restoration, and breakthrough for you and others, that the Kingdom may advance through you on earth.
6. Pray that this year, God will expand your territory in every area by opening new doors in different spheres of life. 1 Chronicles 4:10
7. Pray for AHOW - that the kingdom of God will be established among us and the will of God will be done in every aspect of AHOW's life.
8. Pray that God will give us to keys to unlock the hearts of people to the gospel in our communities and many will come to Christ this year. 2 Cor. 4:4

The Kingdom Key of Forgiveness

Matthew 6:5-15

Key Verse: Matthew 6:14-15 *“For if you forgive other people when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive others their sins, your Father will not forgive your sins.” – NIV*

Reflection: Forgiveness is a powerful key in the life of a Christian—a key that opens doors healing, peace, and freedom. Jesus teaches us in Matthew 6:14-15 that forgiveness is not optional for followers of Christ; it is essential. When we forgive others, we open the door to God's forgiveness in our own lives.

Forgiveness, however, is not always easy. Many times we struggle with feelings of hurt, betrayal, or anger. Yet, holding on to unforgiveness can imprison us in bitterness, keeping us from experiencing the full peace and blessings that God offers. Jesus reminds us that just as God has forgiven us for our countless sins, we must also extend that same grace to others.

Forgiveness does not mean ignoring wrongs or pretending they never happened. It means releasing the burden of resentment and trusting God to heal the wounds. Many times, doors of breakthrough, blessings, deliverance and freedom are closed because we ignore the key of forgiveness. Forgiveness may feel like a difficult decision, but it is a powerful key. It is through forgiveness that we walk in the fullness of God's love and peace. Are you holding unforgiveness, bitterness or malice against anyone? If you are, then you are closing certain doors of blessing in your life. Ask God to help you to use this key.

1. Thank God for the gift of Jesus that through Him we have redemptions and the forgiveness of our sin. Ephesians 1:7
2. Thank God for the power in the blood of Jesus that washes us, cleanses us and opens a door of access to God for us. Romans 5:2
3. Ask God to give you an eternal perspective about forgiveness and release supernatural grace to make forgiveness easy for you.
4. Forgiveness opens doors of healing, deliverance and blessing – ask God for grace to forgive so you can enjoy the blessing that follows.
5. Pray for AHOW – that there will be spirit of love, unity and forgiveness and we will learn to make allowance for each other's faults and forgive anyone who offends us. Colossians 3:13
6. Pray that we will have the freedom and courage to confess our faults with one another so that we may be healed. James 5:16
7. Pray that the anointing that breaks yokes will rest upon us and set free everyone in our minds being held by the bondage of addictions (drugs, sex, pornography, gambling). Jeremiah 30:8
8. Pray especially for our young people, that God will protect them from every form of entanglement of the enemy, the world and of the flesh. Heb.12:1

The Kingdom Key of Prayer

Matthew 7:7-12

Key Verse: *Matthew 7:7-8* “Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. 8 For everyone who asks receives, and he who seeks finds, and to him who knocks it will be opened.”

Reflection: Another important key of the kingdom is prayer. In Matthew 7:7-8, Jesus promises that when we ask, seek, and knock, doors will be opened to us. This promise speaks to the power of the key of prayer in unlocking the opportunities God has for our lives. Prayer is not only an act of communication with God, but it is also an invitation for Him to move in our lives in ways that we cannot accomplish on our own. Apostle James is certainly right when He says, “Yet you do not have because you do not ask.” (James 4:2)

When we ask in prayer, we acknowledge that God is the source of every good thing. He knows what we need before we ask, yet He delights in our requests. Prayer aligns our hearts with His will and opens the door to His blessings. Prayer unlocks doors that God did not intend to close but were closed by the enemy.

Seeking God through prayer means looking beyond our own desires and seeking His direction. Prayer also helps with discernment. Often open doors require discernment, and prayer helps us understand God’s plan for us. It’s in those quiet moments with Him that we gain clarity and insight. Knocking in prayer represents persistence. We may face delays or opposition, but we are called to keep knocking. The more we persevere in prayer, the more we grow in faith and confidence that God will open the right doors at the right time.

1. Thank God for grace and strength he has given you to enter into day eight of the 21-day challenge. Thank Him for the blessings so far and yet to come.
2. Pray that God will remove prayerlessness from your life and release fire upon your altar of prayer. Leviticus 6:13
3. Pray that the Lord will baptize you with the spirit of grace and prayer, and release on you grace for prayer that unlock closed doors. Zechariah 12:10
4. Pray for boldness and authority to prevail in place of prayer, move mountains and command bigger doors to open. Psalm 2:8
5. Pray that as you ask, seek, and knock, by faith, God will open the doors He has prepared for you and strengthen your faith and guide your steps.
6. For AHOW - Pray that God will take us to the next level in our corporate prayer and there will be a greater desire for prayer in AHOW. Matthew 21:13
7. Pray that the Holy Spirit will confirm His words in our midst with miracles, signs and wonders like never before. Mark 16:20
8. Pray that AHOW doors will continually be opened so that the unsaved, the sick, the broken and the oppressed will come in and encounter Jesus the door. Isaiah 60:11.

The Kingdom Key of Faith

Hebrews 4:1-10

Key Verse: Hebrews 4:2 "For we also have had the gospel preached to us, just as they did; but the message they heard was of no value to them, because they did not share the faith of those who obeyed." – (NIV)

Reflection: In Hebrews 4:2, we are reminded of the essential role faith plays in receiving God's promises. This verse highlights a key truth: hearing God's Word is not enough; we must receive it with faith. Faith is the key that unlocks the realities of the promises of God in our lives.

The Israelites heard God's promises in the wilderness, but many did not enter the promised land because they lacked faith. They were unable to believe that God could deliver on His promises despite the obstacles before them. Similarly, many of us have received promises, prophetic words and instructions from God. Yet, without faith, the message has no power to deliver their intent.

Faith is the key that opens the door to God's blessings. It is not merely intellectual acknowledgment but a deep trust in God's character and ability to fulfill His Word. Faith leads to obedience—it moves us to act on God's promises, even when circumstances seem impossible.

In our own lives, the key of faith unlocks the full potential of God's promises. As we believe and trust in His Word, we position ourselves to experience His peace, guidance, and provision. May we always respond in faith to the gospel, knowing that when we trust God, we step into His perfect will for our lives.

1. Start by praying in the Spirit for an extended period. If you have not received the prayer language, ask God for it and believe that you will receive it today.
2. Thank God again for what He has started in your life through this 21-day fast. As you fast, pray and worship, you are waiting on Him and exchanging your strength with that of the Lord for the journey ahead.
3. Lord, strengthen my faith as I walk through the doors you open for me and help me trust you every step of the way.
4. Ask God to give you the spirit of faith that you need to walk through your open doors of opportunities. 2 Corinthians 4:13-17
5. Pray for a greater revelation of Jesus for every AHOW member. Heb.8:11
6. Pray that the Word of God will be alive and active in our midst; sharper than any double-edged sword, penetrating even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow and judging the thoughts and attitudes of the heart. Hebrews 4:12
7. Pray that God will stretch forth His hand in our midst for greater level of healings and perform greater miracles in our midst. Acts 4:30
8. Pray that AHOW will be a house of prayer and miracles, where miracles will be a regular occurrence. Matthew 21:13.

The Kingdom Key of Fasting

Matthew 17:14-21

Key Verse: Matthew 17:21 “However, this kind does not go out except by prayer and fasting.” (NKJV)

Reflection: In Matthew 17:21, Jesus says, “However, this kind does not go out except by prayer and fasting.” This verse highlights the powerful connection between fasting, prayer, and spiritual breakthrough. When the disciples were unable to cast out a demon, Jesus revealed that certain challenges in life require a deeper level of faith and spiritual preparation. Fasting is a key to unlocking God’s power in our lives, especially when we face situations that seem insurmountable.

By fasting, we set aside our physical desires to focus on seeking God’s presence and direction. It is in this place of humility and dependence on God that the doors of spiritual breakthrough open. Fasting is often misunderstood as simply abstaining from food, but it is much more than that—it is a spiritual discipline that aligns our hearts with God’s will and empowers us to break through barriers that hinder our growth and purpose.

Fasting opens doors by increasing our sensitivity to the Holy Spirit, allowing us to hear God’s voice more clearly. It helps us lay aside distractions and shift our focus entirely onto Him. As we fast, we not only seek answers but also invite God’s transformative power into our lives. When we face obstacles or strongholds, fasting becomes a key that unlocks the doors to healing, deliverance, and victory. As we embrace fasting with prayer, we open ourselves to greater intimacy with God and the breakthrough He desires to bring.

1. Thank God for His generosity toward us that He gave us His only begotten son Jesus Christ. 1 John 3:1
2. Pray for a true revelation of the power and purpose of fasting and that God will give you the key to use fasting to open doors in your life.
3. Pray that this fast will open doors of liberation, bringing release from the strongholds that have kept you bound in any area of your life.
4. Pray that this fasting will lead to a deeper spiritual maturity, empowering you to walk in greater intimacy with God and greater purpose in the Kingdom.
5. For AHOW – Pray that every closed door in the lives of people will open. 2 Corinthians 8:15
6. Contend for open doors of marriage in AHOW – Pray that God will open doors of new and fruitful relationship for singles in AHOW.
7. Contend for open door of fruitfulness in AHOWFC – Pray that God will open doors of conception among us.
8. Pray that through this fast, God will open doors of favor and provision among us. Pray that this fast will open doors to financial blessings, career advancement, and opportunities to serve others for His glory. Isaiah 58:6.

The Kingdom Key of Obedience

Deuteronomy 1:1-8

Key Verse: Deuteronomy 1:8 *"See, I have given you this land. Go in and take possession of the land the Lord swore he would give to your ancestors, to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, and to their descendants after them." (NIV)*

Reflection: In Deuteronomy 1:8, God speaks to the Israelites, commanding them to step forward and take possession of the land He has promised them. This passage shows us that while God opens doors of opportunity, we must act in obedience to walk through them. Obedience is therefore one of the keys to open doors in our lives.

God's open doors are often accompanied by a call to step out in faith. The Israelites were given a land, but they needed to step out to take possession of it. This wasn't a passive experience—they had to enter the land, fight battles, and trust God's provision. Similarly, when God opens a door for us, it requires obedience and action.

Obedience to walk through open doors isn't always easy. It may require courage, sacrifice, or willingness to be uncomfortable. God promises to be with us as we step forward in faith. He will equip us for the journey and provide what we need.

Obedience is the key to walking through open doors even as we trust in God's promises and His timing. If God has opened a door for you, don't hesitate. Obey His call, knowing that He has already prepared the way.

1. Thank God for His faithfulness to His promises – that we serve a God who is not a man to lie or change His mind concerning His promises. Num 23:19
2. Pray that God will give you a heart that is fully surrendered to His will and help you to obey without hesitation or doubt when He opens doors for you. Let my faith in Your plan outweigh any fear or insecurity, and may my obedience bring glory to Your name
3. Pray that God will work in you both to will and do His will in every area in 2025. Philippians 2:13
4. Pray you will be able to renounce your personal agendas, life goals, and aspirations, contrary to God's purpose and begin to respond in radical obedience to everything God will show you. 2 Corinthians 6:2
5. Ask God to help you to trust His perfect timing as you walk through the open doors. Ask Him to remove anxiety or impatience that leads to disobedience.
6. Ask God to strengthen your resolve by the Spirit to act on His leading knowing that He will go before you and will equip you for the task at hand.
7. Pray for courage to follow God's direction, even when the path seems uncertain.
8. Pray for breakthroughs in AHOW in the area of relationships and weddings; that 2025 will be a year of supernatural relationships and connections.

The Kingdom Key of Spiritual Maturity **James 4:8, Galatians 4:1-5**

Key Verse: James 4:8 *“Draw near to God and He will draw near to you. Cleanse your hands, you sinners; and purify your hearts, you double-minded.” (NKJV)”*

Reflection: Spiritual maturity is essential for unlocking the doors to a deeper relationship with God and the fullness of His blessings. James 4:8 offers a clear invitation: “Come near to God and He will come near to you.” This powerful promise is the foundation of spiritual growth. When we intentionally seek God—through prayer, worship, and meditating on His Word—He draws near to us. Our spiritual growth begins when we open the door to God’s presence, allowing Him to shape and mold us into His likeness.

However, spiritual growth requires more than simply drawing near. In Galatians 4:1-5, Paul explains that while we are heirs to God's kingdom, we must grow and mature in our faith to fully receive what God has prepared for us. Just as an underage heir is not yet able to fully enjoy their inheritance, spiritual immaturity keeps us from stepping into the fullness of God’s promises. Growth in faith means growing in understanding, obedience, and character, so we can walk in the inheritance God has for us.

The way to spiritual maturity opens for us when we choose to draw near to God, mature in our faith, and embrace the fullness of His plans for our lives. As we grow, we become more equipped to live out His purpose and to be trusted with the keys of the kingdom to do exploits for God.

1. Thank God for His love, faithfulness and commitment to our growth and to becoming like Christ. Ephesians 4:13
2. Ask God to help you to take deliberate steps towards Him every day through prayer, worship, and obedience – leading you to a deeper, more intimate relationship with God this year. James 4:8
3. Pray that God will purify your thoughts, desires, and actions, so that you may walk in holiness and experience the fullness of His presence. Romans 12:1-2
4. Pray that the Holy Spirit will help you to understand and embrace your identity as His son/daughter, and co-heir with Jesus Christ.
5. Pray that this revelation will guide your spiritual growth and lead you to live in the freedom and authority you’ve been given in Christ.
6. Pray for the spirit of wisdom and revelation in His knowledge leading you into a deeper knowledge of His will that pleases Him in every way. Eph 1:17
7. Pray that God will help you to recognize areas where you may still be spiritually immature and empower you to grow into the fullness of Christ.
8. For AHOW - pray that AHOW will be a place of raising disciples and leading people into spiritual maturity. Ephesians 4:13

The Kingdom Key of Service

Galatians 5:1-15

Key Passage: *Galatians 5:13* "You, my brothers and sisters, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the flesh; rather, serve one another humbly in love." – (NIV)

Reflection: As believers, we are called to freedom in Christ, but that freedom is not for selfish gain—it is for service. In Galatians 5:13, Paul reminds us that our freedom in Christ is meant to serve one another in love. The open key of service is an invitation to step into a life of humility, where we put others' needs before our own and reflect God's love through our actions. Many doors God has for us will not open until we embrace a life of selfless service. Selfishness closes doors, selflessness opens doors.

Service is an expression of our faith and a response to the gifts God has given us. 1 Corinthians 12:7 teaches that each believer is given a unique spiritual gift for the common good. These gifts are not meant to be hoarded or used for personal gain but to serve and build up the body of Christ. When we use our gifts to serve, we not only fulfill our purpose but also contribute to God's work in the world. In addition, our service opens doors for others to talk into their blessings.

The key door of service encourages us to live selflessly, sharing our time, resources, and talents with others. Through service, we grow in Christlikeness and bring His love to those around us. As we use this key, it opens to us the door of joy and fulfillment that comes from living a life of humble service.

1. Thank God for Jesus Christ, our example in service – as the scripture says "the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many." Matthew 20:28
2. Ask God for grace to be like Christ, putting others' needs before your own and reflect God's love through our actions.
3. Pray for grace to discover and stir up the gifts of God that is in you and use it to serve and contribute to God's work in the world. 2 Timothy 1:6
4. Your purpose is tied to service - pray that God will open the door of opportunities to locate your area of service and fulfil your purpose in Christ.
5. Ask God to cultivate in you a heart that strives for excellence in all you do so that you may serve others with diligence and passion, not with mediocrity but striving to give your very best for the glory of God. Colossians 3:23-24
6. Ask God to release the grace of service upon AHOW so that every member will embrace a life of service to God and to one another.
7. For AHOW – pray that AHOW will be a place that unlocks people's purpose, nurture their gifts and deploy them to do great things for the kingdom.
8. Pray that our service will unlock the doors of opportunities, favor and blessings for you in every area.

The Kingdom Key of Wisdom

Proverbs 8:1-12

Key Verse: Proverbs 8:10-12 *“Choose my instruction instead of silver, knowledge rather than choice gold, for wisdom is more precious than rubies, and nothing you desire can compare with her. I, wisdom, dwell together with prudence; I possess knowledge and discretion. To fear the Lord is to hate evil; I hate pride and arrogance, evil behavior and perverse speech.” (NIV)*

Reflection: In Proverbs 8, the wise man presents wisdom to us as priceless—more valuable than silver, gold, or rubies. The invitation to seek wisdom is clear: it is the key that opens doors to lasting success and fulfillment. While the world often places value on wealth and material possessions, Proverbs reminds us that wisdom is the true treasure that unlocks doors to a meaningful, godly life.

Wisdom opens doors by guiding us in the way of righteousness, helping us make choices that align with God’s will. In these verses, wisdom is linked to prudence, knowledge, and discretion—qualities that equip us to navigate life with clarity and integrity. When we choose wisdom, we receive not only knowledge but also the ability to make sound decisions that honor God and lead to blessings.

The wisdom being talked about here is the wisdom from above which is radically different from the wisdom of the world (James 3:17). As we pursue Godly wisdom, we also develop a deeper fear of the Lord—an awe and reverence that leads us away from pride, arrogance, and evil. By choosing wisdom over worldly gain, we invite God’s guidance into every aspect of our lives, opening doors to opportunities, peace, and spiritual growth.

1. Thank God for the gift of wisdom that He has given to us through Jesus and the Holy Spirit. Ephesians 1:17
2. Pray that your heart would truly value and seek wisdom above all else and prioritize wisdom over worldly desires and material gain. Proverbs 8:10
3. Ask God to give you the Spirit of wisdom and revelation, so that you may know him better and seize every opportunity He places before you.
4. Ask God for wisdom in all your relationships and to speak with grace, act with understanding in your interactions with others. Proverbs 8:12
5. Pray for wisdom to understand God’s will for your life, and that He will open your eyes to the path He has prepared for you and give you the courage to walk in it with faith and confidence.
6. Pray for wisdom to understand the will of God so that you will know the riches of His glorious inheritance for you. Ephesians 5:17
7. Pray that God will help you to find clarity about your purpose and help you to remember that satisfying purpose happens only when you seek after Him.
8. Pray that through AHOW, the manifold wisdom of God will be made known to many according to His eternal purpose in Christ Jesus. Ephesians 3:10

Jesus, the Door and the Key

John 10:1-10

Key Passage: *John 10:9* - "I am the door. If anyone enters by Me, he will be saved, and will go in and out and find pasture." ~ (NKJV)"

Reflection: As we conclude this 21-day fasting and devotional, all the teaching will be incomplete without letting you know that Jesus is the door and the key. In John 10:9, Jesus says, "I am the door; if anyone enters by me, he will be saved and will go in and out and find pasture." It is only through Jesus that we have access to salvation and to the kingdom with its riches and blessings.

On top of that, Jesus the door has also given us the key to the doors. Once you enter the main door of the kingdom (which is Jesus), you then have access to the keys to different compartments in the kingdom. In Matthew 28:18-19, Jesus said "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations." He also said, "And whatever you ask in My name, that I will do, that the Father may be glorified in the Son." (John 14:13).

A door then, is not merely a physical object but a powerful symbol in Scripture of access, transition, and divine invitation. Jesus is our access – access to salvation, to God, to life, to victory, to blessing and to everything you need for life and godliness. Ephesians 2:18 says "For through him we both have access to the Father by one Spirit". That is why Jesus is the greatest gift of all. He is the gift of access. God didn't give us many gifts, He gave us Jesus and through Him we have access to all gifts. That is why we can say God "has blessed us in the heavenly realms with every spiritual blessing in Christ." Ephesians 1:3

1. Thank God for the salvation of your soul and that you have been adopted into God's family, no longer a stranger but a member of His household. Eph.2:19
2. Thank God for Jesus, through whom we have access to the Father by one Spirit and to His inheritance of the saints. Ephesians 2:18
3. Pray that you will know Jesus more and more and will develop intimacy with Him, and hence enjoy everything God has in store for you in Him. Eph. 1:3
4. Pray for grace to follow Jesus closely and diligently so that you may know Him better and walk in your inheritance.
5. Pray against every stumbling block in you and around you that will prevent you from following Jesus closely as you should.
6. Pray that you will be able to discern the will of God in 2025 concerning every area of your life and walk in it. Isaiah 30:21
7. Pray that the knowledge of Christ will permeate every facet of AHOW – our children, youths, adults such that everyone will grow in their knowledge of Christ. Hebrews 8:11
8. Pray for our children and youths, that they will be taught of the Lord and will experience physical, emotional, and spiritual growth this year. Isaiah 54:13
